

"LIGHTS OUT" IN NEW YORK

Every night, all over the world near local midnight, a 500-mi high polar orbiting Defense Meteorological Satellite "sees" and records this view. The night of July 13, 1977 was no exception. On this night, there was a marked difference in the usual picture of the East Coast of the U.S.. New York City was undergoing a massive power failure.
